SAN BERNARDINO HOMICIDE RATE DECREASED IN 2017

History:

The Pastors in San Bernardino have been in battle with poverty, crime, and blighted conditions that plague the Inland Empire areas for decades. And as a result of the tragedy that befell us on **December 2, 2015**, 14 people were killed and 22 others were seriously injured in a terrorist attack consisting of a mass



shooting and an attempted bombing at the Inland Regional Center. The San Bernardino Pastors have adopted an alert system to notify designated Pastors of active emergency & to respond rendering aide. This service is our united front to respond to crisis.

On or about **August 31, 2016**, police shootings of black and brown men nationwide was at an alarming rate. The local residence were beginning to protest; the Chief of Police, Jarod Burguan requested a summit of local church leaders over 80 faith based organizations responded to help stop the violence and create channels of communication regarding shootings, and other issues. The group created methods to intervene and prevent civil disobedience. The Pastors organized a committed to address concerns, homicides, and minority and police race relations. As of October murder rate dropped from 111 to 60, a 40% decrease. To God be the Glory,

CERT training and getting your amateur radio license are recommended for VOAD members. Both are typically offered for FREE. To find a CERT class, contact your local fire department or city hall (not all communities have CERT). For unincorporated communities, CERT training is available through the San Bernardino County Fire Department Office of Emergency Services at 909.356.3998.

Following a major disaster, telephones may not be working. Amateur radio is the most viable form of communication post disaster. In the event of an actual emergency, the following contingency plan has been developed:

I. Contact is initiated from first responders and/or the Pastor to ground zero through group me texting or email communication.

II. Coordinate support to the victims at the site:

All Teams Intervene through

Assist lead Pastors at site, **verify the resources that will may be needed on site, natural and spiritual; coordinate safety, security and condition of each victim. Remain at site through the duration, rotating Pastors support based on victim's needs.**

Assist:
Families
Children
Community at large

Our goal is to mobilize support to lead Pastor on site- Unite leadership in solidarity to assist. To Calm residence, show support through a-being there b- provide needs c- counsel

After the initial emergency, follow-up with the lead pastor to show ongoing unity and support to the victims and families.

III.

Follow-up with counseling, prayer and group support to network needed services and showing ongoing support and needs analysis.

April 10, 2017, a shooting occurred inside a special education classroom at North Park Elementary School. The shooting was an apparent murder-suicide; three people, the gunman; his wife, and a student standing behind her died at the scene.
